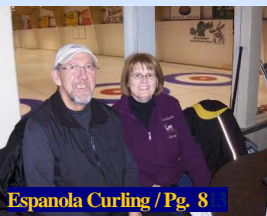

Brief Biography of Brother George John Anglin BURY

Brother George Bury was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba on November 28, 1914. He was educated in Vancouver, British Columbia, and completed his post secondary education at Spottshaw Electronic Training Centre.

In 1940, Brother Bury joined the Royal Canadian Air Force. It was in 1943 that he received his commission and was promoted to the rank of Flight Lieutenant.

The war continued to rage on and George was part of the Royal Air Force Committee to plan a joint RAF/RCAF airfield in the Philippines, in order to be ready to bomb Japan. After the war ended, he was transferred to Washington for a period of time and then onto Ottawa; it was there that he was promoted once again this time to the rank of Wing Commander.

In 1948, Brother George joined the mysterious and secrets of our gentle Masonic Craft. From 1957 to 1961, Brother George was posted to London, England to be part of a joint staff. Following that period, he returned to Ottawa and retired in 1964 as a Senior Wing Commander.

Following his civilian position, he retired in 1979 and continued to reside in Ottawa, until moving to Little Current in 2006.

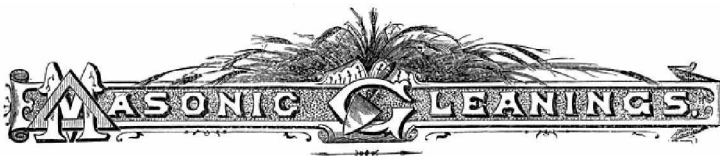


Then on Saturday, February 19th 2011 another 24 children were identified at a clinic held at the Belrock Masonic Centre.

V.W. Bro. William Robert McKnight Biography Of A Husband, Father and Friend Sudbury Lodge No. 658

William McKnight or Bill, is a good man to have on your team. He is able to look at situations and provide what is needed for the team, whether that is to stay in the background and let things develop or provide leadership when required.

It was fortunate that a lot of good information was available for this biography, mostly due to the help of a couple of people.

His son, David, has been most helpful in supplying background information to R.W. Bro. Eric T. Moore for a Dinner speech where Bill received an award in Sault Ste Marie recently. I have borrowed liberally from that and the quotes are mostly from David's writing. There was also material from Bill himself and the Trout Lake Camper's Association.

Bill was born May 16, 1926 in Medicine Hat, Alberta. His family moved to Owen Sound, Ontario, then on to Sudbury in 1938. His father, Robert, worked at Davidson's Garage (later Sudbury Motors). He attended Gatchell Public School, "where he was allowed to skip a Grade. Even as a young lad Bill was recognized for his skills and abilities. He then went to Sudbury Mining and Technical School where he graduated. After his graduation he started to work with INCO."

Bill volunteered for the Armed Services at the age of seventeen when the Second World War broke out. After his training, he mainly guarded prisoners. He claims he got the best brush-cuts he ever had from a German prisoner at the Camp.

While he was recovering from an injury, in which he lost his little finger, he began acting in a Play at St. Andrews Church.

According to his son, "His interest in the stage could be explained by the fact that Marian Hunt was also involved in these Productions-especially one called **A Farce in Three Acts**. Their motto was "If it wasn't a farce before we it started, it was when it was finished." "We must believe that it was all for love-Bill hasn't acted before or since- and he married Marian three years later in 1949."



His son also tells us that "Bill was an excellent father-always interested in his sons' lives and now his grandchildren's activities. He spent many evenings sitting in the stands at basketball games and freezing beside football fields. He continues to support his children and his grandchildren in all their endeavours."

He worked 42 years for International Nickel Company (later INCO) in the Mechanical Department. His last 15 years he worked as a Mine Hoist Inspector. He retired in 1984 from INCO and has been busy ever since with various activities such as fishing, hunting, bowling, curling and Scouting. He gave up bowling due to his commitments in Scouting and he stopped Curling when he became active with Lodge. He was very active in Scouting becoming Training Chairman, working with Scout Leaders then spent four years as President of the District Council.

Bill has made excellent use of leisure time. While some of us consider leisure as resting, Bill has used his time to work his way through the Chairs in Lodge, working his way through the various levels in the command structure of Scouting, and helping form and run the Trout Lake Camper's Association.

Trout Lake has been a very special spot for Bill and his family. When a fellow employee at INCO mentioned to Bill that some property was becoming available at Trout Lake, he decided to go have a look. Bill and his father ventured out to check out the property when the only road in the Trout Lake area was to Happy Landing Lodge. There they boarded their homemade plywood boat with a 7 hp motor on it and he staked his property and purchased it. Marian came with him the next year to see it and had the privilege of riding in on the bulldozer which was building their new road. The camps were built cooperatively, with each person contributing their specialized knowledge to the group effort. The article from some years ago in the "Trout Lake Camper's Association Newsletter" which featured Bill, called "Safety First, The McKnight Story" is entertaining in the recalling of the beginnings of the development of the Lake area. In his own words, Bill claims, "We really had some good times at Driftwood (Road) we could work all day on the camps and go on to Driftwood in the evening, play Liar's Dice long into the night and then go back in the pitch black night, no hydro on the lake, no markers on the dangerous rocks". When the interviewers asked about the rules for Liar's Dice game, his youngest son Allen piped up "you can only understand the rules after you drink four beers". It seems that they had some good fun along with the hard work. They had to bring construction materials in by boat for the original hunt camp. The main camp saw a large truck deliver the materials over the ice in winter. The camping tradition has lasted to this day for Bill and family. Hunting, fishing and being together at camp is still an important part of their lives.

He and Marian, after Bill's retirement spent four months of every year in Florida. He says he was "very lucky to meet many friends in the Craft and became very active in Florida during the winter months."

Bill has been very involved in Masonry and concordant bodies over the years. He was Initiated into Sudbury Lodge #658 June 1964, and Raised to Master Mason May 21, 1965. Bill was Installed as Worshipful Master of Sudbury Lodge in 1977 and again in 1978 as he served two consecutive years as Master. He was District Secretary for the 1981-82 year and Grand Steward in 1982-83. Bill joined Tuscan Chapter October 27, 1973

(M.M.M., M.E.M., H.R.E. October 27, 1973) and became First Principal in 1983. He has been a Life Member since November 27, 1989, and Grand Sword Bearer in 2001. He joined the Mavar Perceptory #65, Red Cross and Malta, May 4 1974 and became Presiding Perceptor in 1982, and Grand Standard Bearer in 1988-89. then Alpha Council

#23 and as Select Master was January 24, 1976, becoming Thrice Illustrious Master in 1984, Grand Assistant Recorder in 1998 and Grand Conductor of Council in 2002. He went on to join Excalibur York Rite College #101 as Knight of York, November 1984, Order of the Silver Trowel in 1985, York Cross of Honour in 1985 became Governor York Rite College 1991-92 and Order of the Purple Cross in 1994.

He joined Northern Lights Conclave #2 as R.C.C., October 4, 1986 and A.O., April 4, 1987, becoming Most Puissant Sovereign in 2006.

Bill joined the A.A.O.N.M.S. Ramses Temple in June 1974 and Sudbury Shrine Club in September 1974, becoming President in 1985. He joined Moore Sovereign Consistory on November 12, 1988.

Bill became a member of Elam Council #34, Order of the High Priesthood as a Charter Member and then President in 2006, the Grand Master of the Order Of The High Priesthood of Ontario 2009-2010.

Bill's contributions to Masonry are many and he has influenced his Brethren and the many bodies related to Masonry over the years and he has made many contributions to Scouting as a King's Scout and later in life as Training Chairman (training leaders) and became President of the Sudbury and District Boy Scouts during which time he was involved in creating the Trout Lake Camper's Association.

It is really refreshing to read his son's words that "He is a great Dad" in the bio-summary he wrote for R W Eric Moore. He is a family man and when Bill mentions Marian, he always refers to "his lady" and while he doesn't often speak of family when we see him at Lodge, it is obvious that they are his priority.

What is apparent from reading all that I have done about Bill and from my own experience is that Bill has been an influence on a lot of people over the years. In Lodge, when you really need someone to do a piece of first rate work, or need advice, Bill has always been there for us. From reading more about his life, he has also been the same for his family; and all the groups in which he participated.

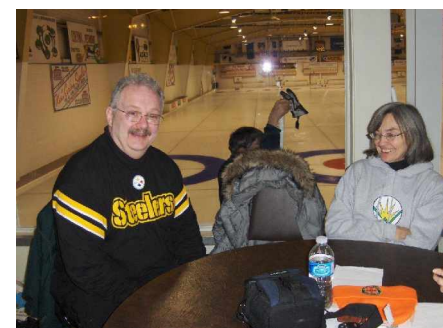

The orders of the Masonic Knights Templar are part of a progression from the first three degrees of Freemasonry. Membership thus involves several prerequisites:

- You must have received the Supreme Degree of the Holy Royal Arch of Jerusalem, the final degree of Royal Arch Masonry, and be a member in good standing of a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons.
- Membership in a Royal Arch Chapter requires that you have been raised as a Master Mason in a Craft lodge and be a member in good standing of a Masonic Craft lodge.

Therefore, an applicant must:

- I. A Freemason in good standing with his Craft lodge;
- II. A Royal Arch Mason in good standing with his chapter; and
- III. A Christian, recommended by two members of the Order, who professes a belief in the "Christian Doctrine of the Holy and Undivided Trinity of The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit".

You may request an application from a preceptory in your area.



Orders are portrayed by the Knights wearing traditional costumes. Each order advances the new Knight through the trials of the Crusaders culminating with Order of The Knights of the Temple or The Templar Knights.

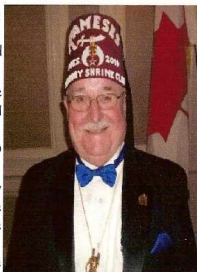
