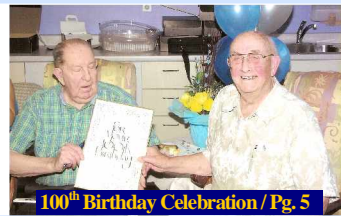

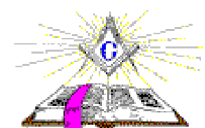

Sudbury - Manitoulin District Project Masonic Foundation of Ontario Project # 2506 Sudbury – Manitoulin Freemasons Helping to Feed the Hungry

On any given day, a number of members of the public go without the necessities of life. Many are hungry and I would like to see the Freemasons of this District help to feed the hungry.

For years the brethren, who attend the weekly Java Guild Sessions, have supported the Soup Kitchen, Food Bank, Elgin Street Mission, and the Salvation Army. In addition, the left-over foods prepared for the weekly luncheons are donated to the Soup Kitchen and/or to the Elgin Street Mission.

Many of our members volunteer at the various Food Banks throughout the District and I am impressed with their zeal in helping the less fortunate. I think the District can do more.

Bro. Geoffrey Lougheed, Chairman of the Food Bank's Board of Directors, has told me that for every \$5.00 donated to the Food Bank it can purchase \$30.00 or more worth of food!

I suggest the following...

Each lodge in the District is to be requested to take a particular month and hold a breakfast/brunch or other fund raising opportunity for the brethren and their families. All monies raised would be donated to the Food Bank Project.

If the lodges wish, they could ask their members to bring in food stuffs for donation to the Food Bank in their particular community. When the accumulation is sufficient then arrange for delivery and a photo opportunity.

The District would apply to the Masonic Foundation for a project number and all donations to the food bank would be given to the Foundation in trust for the Food Bank and hopefully partially matched by the Foundation.

The Foundation will issue Income Tax receipts and the brethren will be able to claim a deduction for income tax purposes.

Each member of the District would be asked to donate to the Masonic Foundation Project for the Sudbury-Manitoulin Food Bank. When the brethren have made their donations then arrangements could be made to present a "big cheque" and a photo opportunity.

Our brethren should be encouraged to continue their volunteer service at the various food banks by packaging orders and serving meals at the Soup Kitchen, Salvation Army and the Elgin Street Mission.

Our members could wear T-shirts with the Square & Compass on the front and the inscription Freemasons Helping to Feed the Hungry.

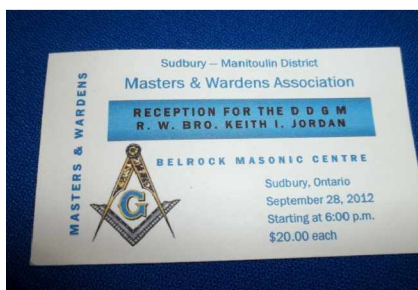
